


On Air invites reflection on humankind's tenacious spirit in a series featuring Brahms, Dvořák and Mozarts' final and finest symphonies

The live entertainment streaming platform offers the world hope with a trio of history's most astonishing masterpieces

Following On Air's global success of its inaugural classical music event last December with Beethoven's 9th Symphony, the streaming platform returns once more to the classical stage to stream the final, sublime symphonies of **Brahms, Dvořák** and **Mozart** from Vienna's Synchron Stage



Austrian conductor Johannes Vogel will conduct the Synchron Stage Orchestra again for the following events: Johannes Brahms' Symphony No. 4 in E minor on 21, 22, and 23 May at 7pm UK time, featuring 60 musicians; Antonin Dvořák's Symphony No. 9 in E minor (New World Symphony) on 18, 19 and 20 June at 7pm UK time, assembling 60 musicians; and Wolfgang Amadeus Mozart's Symphony No. 41 in C major (Jupiter Symphony) on 10, 11 and 12 September at 7pm UK time, performed by 40 musicians

Each symphony reminds us that there is great cause for hope in our turbulent times: Brahms' 4th and last symphony pulses with positive energy and swirls with trance-like melodies that serves to carry away sorrows and reminds us of the power of positivity; Dvořák's New World Symphony, one

of the most famous works in classical music history, is filled with the spirit of modernism whilst also paying homage to tradition. It fizzles with hope and joy, and is uplifting throughout; and Mozart's visionary 41st Symphony, named "Jupiter" by critics as it is an example of divine perfection, is one of the most complex, most exciting compositions ever made, that represents the possibilities of mankind

The performances, captured in Vienna's state-of-the-art recording facility, combine high-end production, set design and atmospheric lighting, giving the viewer the closest approximation to a live experience

Speaking of the upcoming performances, Johannes Vogel said: *"These symphonies are linked as they are the last and most famous symphonies written by their composers. They also each ring with hope, which is exactly what we need in the ongoing crisis. I have chosen these symphonies as they each show us the remarkable capabilities of the human mind; what we can achieve through our creativity and positivity to make the world a better place to live in. There are always ways to shape how we live despite our circumstances, and music has the power to provide the light, clarity, and insight that is needed to help us move forward."*

Health safety in the ongoing crisis is of the utmost importance to On Air, and as such the cycle of performances at The Synchron Stage will be handled in a safe, Covid-secure way

Previously, Johannes Vogel has worked with orchestras including Vienna Philharmonic and Opernhaus Zürich. In his other roles as composer and producer, he's worked for film and TV shows including "His Dark Materials" and "Crimson Peak"

On Air is predominantly known for its high-quality concert performances in the pop and mainstream sectors, having previously streamed performances from artists such as Arlo Parks and Skepta. Looking ahead to summer, they will stream Tinie from the Royal Albert Hall
